Some nonprofits will want their codes to reflect or incorporate specific standards, such as those articulated in the [Code of Ethics of the National Association of Social Workers](#), or other sector-specific codes. Other nonprofits will want to reflect their own unique culture, activities and interaction with clients, volunteers, and the public.
